Why messages like March 1?

- 1. To be "Bereans" who "received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true." (Acts 17:11)
- 2. To see the "God-thread" in the tapestry of the book of Acts. "And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved" (Acts 2:47).
- "And God's grace was so powerfully at work in them all that there were no needy persons among them" (Acts 4:33-34).
- "...and all who were appointed for eternal life believed" (Acts 13:48).
- "When he arrived, he was a great help to those who by grace had believed" (Acts 18:27).

Acts 16:1-15 (3 short but crucial stories)

- Verses 1-5: Gentiles do not have to become Jews in order to be followers of Jesus
- 2. Verses 6-10: the message of Jesus moves from Asia to Europe
- 3. Verse 11-15: Lydia responds to the message of Jesus
- Philippi:
 - "they probably headed toward the Gangites River about a mile and a half west of the city"
 - Lydia from the city of Thyatira [400 km east of Philippi], a dealer in purple cloth.
 - Lydia was a worshiper of God (a "God fearer").

"The Lord opened her heart to respond to Paul's message" (Acts 16:14)

- 1. She could not open her own heart
- 2. "Heart" = the seat of thought, emotion, will
- 3. "Opening" her heart like Jesus opened up the eyes of the blind (Mark 7:34; Luke 24:31)
